New Proposal (changes in "red" color):

611.3.2.1 Utilization of times taken by hand (or system-B)
 Hand times may be used in the official results after a correction has been calculated. Calculation of the correction: Subtract the electronic time of day from the time of day taken by hand for the 10 competitors starting before the missing time. If there are not 10 times before, complete the calculation with the remaining times after the missed time. The sum of the 10 time of day differences is divided by 10 and rounded up or down (0.044 -> 0.04, 0.045 -> 0.05) to give the correction which must be applied to the hand time of the competitor without an electronic time.

Comments/Reasons:

Clarification about the definition of the word "time" in the ICR art. concerned and harmonization with the manual given in the Timing Booklet.

New Proposal (changes in "red" color):

1232.4

If both competitors do not finish the second run, the result of the first run counts. If both competitors were tied after the first run, the winner of the second run or the competitor who completed the most gates in the second run will advance to the next round. If only one competitor is disqualified or does not finish in the second run of a heat the competitor is eliminated.

If both competitors are tied after the second run the competitor who wins the second run advances to the next round. In case of a tie in both runs the competitor with the lower bib will advance to the next round.

~~In case of a tie in both runs the competitor with the lower bib will advance to the next round.~~
If both competitors are tied after the second run in the Final and/or the Small Final, competitors will be ranked equally (tie). They will be ordered by descending bib number.

Comments/Reasons:

Precision to the original meaning and adapt to the present special rules.
